

Chilli Varieties 2018



A quick guide to the chillies growing at The Community Farm this year.



Hungarian Hot Wax (Green)

Mild to medium heat with a sweet taste.

Pale green to yellow.

Large. Approximately 35g each.

Early Jalapeno (Green)

Medium heat.

Dark green.

Bullet shape.

Approximately 20g each.



Slim Jim (Green)

Medium hot.

Anaheim type 10-15cm long.

Large. Approximately 15g each.

Note: much larger than green Ring O Fire, but milder.



Ring O Fire (Green and Red)

Hot 'bird eye' chilli (70-80K Scoville).

Green variety is slightly milder than the red.

Approximately 8 to 10g each.

Green available from August, reds (in wholesale quantities) from September onwards.





Basque (Red)

Mild to medium with sweet flavour.
Large red chilli. Approximately 25g each.
Traditional Espelette variety from the Basque area of France where it's a Product of Designated Origin.
Small quantities during August.
Main crop in September.

Barak (Red)

Hot (50-60K Scoville).
Bullet shape.
Medium sized red chilli.
Approximately 7g each.



Cherry Bomb (Red)

Mild/medium (6K Scoville).
Round, red and sweet.
Approximately 15g each.
Available from September.



Habanero (Orange and Red)

Very hot (200K Scoville).
Approximately 8g each.
Available from late September.
Main crop in October.



Scotch Bonnet (Yellow and Red)

Very hot (200-350K Scoville).
Approximately 12g each.
Available from late September.
Main crop in October.
